provided by the proposer)	The following announcement was recently made by HM Government, as part of a series of decisions on road and rail infrastructure projects:
	"The delivery of the final phase of the South West Rail Resilience Programme is on hold but preliminary works to support cliff monitoring and drainage are progressing. We have already invested significantly in securing the cliffs and making the coastline more resilience in the South West and need to focus our investment on other projects around the country. We will keep this scheme under review as the preliminary works complete and for funding at future fiscal events."

It is important that the Council speaks up on issues that while outside its remit, nonetheless affect residents and businesses – especially in this case, given Penzance's status as a railway town. Proposers signature Confirmed by email Confirmed by email		The South West Rail Resilience Programme is the package of works required to stabilise and protect the main line into Devon and Cornwall along the coastal stretch through Dawlish and Teignmouth, which is at increasing risk from extreme weather events and rising sea levels. The decision announced by the government effectively postpones completion of this vital work indefinitely. Penzance is a railway town: it is the terminus of the iconic GWR line, and the railways are a major part of the local economy. In recent years there has been investment in the maintenance depot a Long Rock, and the extension to Ponsandane sidings. The railway is a lifeline for local residents and businesses alike, and a major driver of sustainable tourism in the area. More broadly, the line through Dawlish serves hundreds of thousands of people across Devon and Cornwall, and there is no alternative rail link. Any prolonged interruption to rail services would have major effects on the economy of large swathes of our communities.
